WAISMAN CENTER EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT- ALBEE MESSING

The Waisman Center is dedicated to advancing knowledge about human development, developmental disabilities, and neurodegenerative diseases through: Research spanning the biological, behavioral and social sciences, Training for students and post-doctoral fellows, providers and the community, Service for individuals with developmental disabilities and their families and Outreach to the community. The Waisman Center provides clinical care through 12 specialty clinics that are operated in collaboration with UW Hospital and Clinics and several UW-Madison Departments. The Waisman Early Childhood Program provides a supportive and enriching environment that fosters each child's social-emotional, cognitive, language and physical development. The WECP began in 1979 as a result of state legislation allocating funding for a preschool at the Waisman Center. Over the years, WECP has become a licensed and accredited preschool and child care program with a mission of including children with special needs in a regular education setting. Approximately two thirds of the children in their program are typically developing, while up to one third may have a special educational need because of developmental delay or disability. Waisman is an internationally renowned center for research and treatment of intellectual developmental disabilities. Their research of rare diseases are a core element of their mission. Rare diseases inform their understanding of the rest of medicine and sometimes turn out to be more common than we thought.
