ROBOTICS IN THE HOSPITAL SETTING

Compared to other minimally invasive procedures, robotic surgery offers advanced benefits. The instruments are smaller and more adaptable than routine laparoscopic tools. The robot allows surgeons greater precision and an increased range of motion, enhancing the surgeon's capabilities to perform delicate procedures.

Like other laparoscopic procedures at St. Elizabeth and ThedaCare, robotic surgery:

- is performed through smaller incisions (compared to traditional surgery), called operating ports
- uses scopes to capture accurate, real-time images of the inner body during surgery
- causes less bleeding and stress on the body
- minimizes pain and discomfort following surgery
- usually means a shorter recovery; many patients go home the same day.

Surgeons at St. Elizabeth Hospital and ThedaCare use an innovative laparoscopic surgical robot called the da Vinci robotic surgical system. This amazing tool integrates the latest advancements in robotics and computer-enhanced technology with a surgeon's skills, using 3D images.

Small incisions are used to insert small instruments and a high-definition 3D camera into the body. Seated at the console, the surgeon views a magnified, high-resolution 3D image of the patient's inner body at the surgical site. The robot imitates the movement of a surgeon in real-time, maneuvering through surgery at the surgeon's command.

The surgical robot cannot be programmed to perform surgery. It is controlled by the surgeon throughout the entire procedure, offering greater accuracy, flexibility and comfort. Some of the types of Robotic surgeries are: General Robotic Surgery, Gynecologic Robotic Surgery, Ear-Nose-Throat Robotic Surgery and Urologic Robotic Surgery.
