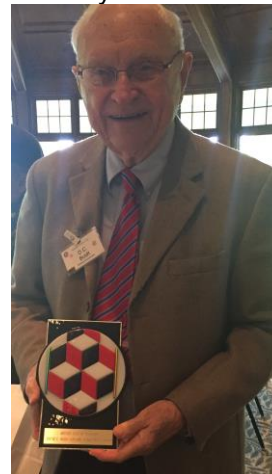

**OSCAR C. BOLDT ROTARY LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD**

This year the Rotary Club of Appleton is celebrating its Centennial Year, and as such The Rotary Recognitions Committee has been charged with reviewing our club's rich history and recognize those Rotarians who have had a significant impact on the success of this premier Fox Cities club. Also, thank you to our honorees family who assisted in today's presentation. For my part, I would like to credit any and all articles that have been written about our honoree and plagiarized by yours truly. O C Boldt, is someone near and dear to our club and community. His personal impact on the Fox Cities and on a wider scale, the construction industry is enormous. Yet, he is a man with a gentle, kind nature who has never forgotten his roots nor has he ever been swept up by all of his success. Humble is a good descriptor. Generous is another. In 1948, annual sales at Boldt Construction were \$100,000. In 2016, annual sales were in excess of \$1billion dollars. With more than 2000 employees, and 14 offices in North America, Boldt Construction is one of the nation's largest construction services firms. OC Bold has been a member of this club since January 5, 1954, 63 years, served as Club President in 1972, and has 7 Paul Harris Fellow recognitions. His life exemplifies the Rotary Four Way Test. He is a man who has shaped the path of the Fox Cities with his leadership, vision, and is like family to many of us. OC describes himself as "an odd combination of spare parts that needed to be remodeled and fashioned to fit into the right spot." Many of us know his life partner of 68 years, Pat, who is a pillar of strength alongside our honoree and is equally loved by our community. As I was doing this research I ran across a facebook comment from former Rotarian and past Appleton Police Chief, Rick Myers, who said the following: OC remains the most inspiring model I have ever had the privilege of being around. He is an intellectual, a philosopher, a philanthropist, and in addition to all those things, a gentleman. His reach extends far beyond the Fox Cities and his legacy goes far beyond his buildings. **Barb Merry – Heeter Award**

### **UNDERSTANDING AND RESPONDING TO SEX TRAFFICKING**

Jonathan Cloud spoke to our club regarding the issues in our area involving sex trafficking. Sex Trafficking is a commercial sex act induced by force, fraud or coercion. There are 100,000 to 300,000 underage girls being sold for sex in America. The average age is between 12-14 years old. The Outagamie County DMST Partnership 2015-2016 Strategy: 1. Prevention: reduce vulnerability of minors experiencing running away, truancy, and domestic violence 2. Protection: rescue minors and adults, provide coordinated multi-agency treatment and support, and apprehend traffickers and buyers 3. Prosecution: a) modified handling of juvenile offenders found to also be victims; b) investigate, charge, and pursue convictions against traffickers. Some progress highlights are Pillars well-established and projects underway, DMST Care Coordinator, Established role of project coordinator, numerous community presentations and trainings, and 3 year strategic action plan for 2016-2019 ratified by steering committee. Vision of what success looks like: 1. Reduction of threat to vulnerable youth and adults of enticement, grooming, entrapment by traffickers 2. Established a well-resourced system of services for survivors of sex trafficking 3. Coordinated anti-human trafficking policing, investigations and prosecution work.
