CHARLES AND ADELE HEETER OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP AWARDS

The Charles and Adele Heeter Outstanding Community Leadership Award is bestowed on Rotarians or individuals of the Appleton/Fox Cities community who exemplify the Rotary Motto of "Service Above Self" by providing significant Rotary and/or community leadership and/or service through the use of his/her time, talent or treasury. Such leadership and/or service should reflect the standards described in the Rotary Four Way Test. These individuals should also demonstrate a strong commitment to volunteerism in one of the four Rotary Avenues of Service outside the scope of his/her normal job responsibilities. The Rotary Club of Appleton has a tradition of giving out this award which is accompanied with a Paul Harris Fellowship. It originated when Charles Heeter made a donation in the amount of \$25,000 to the Appleton Rotary Foundation. The Charles Heeter Fund was then started to recognize outstanding community leaders. Today, this endowment fund is over \$100,000 because of the generous donations from Rotarians and investment results. In 2001, upon his retirement from Kimberly-Clark today's Heeter Award recipient joined our Rotary Club. A graduate of a prestigious institution – Dartmouth College – his philanthropic roots run deep to this Ivy League school. So deep are his roots to Dartmouth that for over 60 consecutive years he has contributed to the *Harold C. Ripley Class of 1929 Society*... so named for alum that annually gifted to the school for an amazing 83 consecutive years until the time of his passing at the age of 103 years. Like Harold Ripley, who was known for his bow-ties (and not the clip-on variety) this gentleman is also very sartorial in nature in his dress and manner of wearing bow-ties as well..... A fact that was not lost on me when I first made his acquaintance in back in 2003. This gentleman was so kind and gracious to sponsor me into the Appleton Rotary. For that I would like to 'thank you' - Ray Durkee - and to be among the first to congratulate on you on the Charles and Patricia Heeter Outstanding Community Service Award. You could say Ray is a deserving nominee for this distinguished award not just because of his many deeds, but because of his valued thoughts as well, and you'd be right. That's because many of us in our Fox Cities community have witnessed first-hand how Ray has made a difference for so many organizations and projects – and the people served – with his head, heart and hands.....Even looking at a short list of the organizations and programs where Ray has chipped in with actions, dedication and hard work or by helping with strategy.....thinking creatively or providing vision and inspiration. Ray's many volunteer roles have included, Board and Committee volunteer for the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region, Serving on the Appleton Medical Center Foundation board and the Appleton Medical Center Ethics Committee, Serving on the ThedaCare's Board of Directors, Engagement with ThedaCare's Community Health Action Team (CHAT)... helping to bring together diverse groups of people to study problems first-hand through "plunges," ...which are day-long events that gather people most affected by or involved in solving an issue or issues. CHAT helps community members share knowledge, learn from those at the heart of the issue, and develop solutions for change, Helping to place defibrillators in many public locations as part of ThedaCare's Heart Health initiative, Leading the AMC's capital campaign to raise millions for cancer services and facilities such as the Martha Siekman Cancer Center and the Breast Cancer Center at AMC and Chairing the Bridges Healthy Cooking School... *Aristotle may have said it, but Ray Durkee has lived it- "We live in deeds: In thoughts not breaths; In Feelings, not figures on the dial. We should count time by hearthrobs. He most lives who thinks most, feels the noblest, acts the best."*
