GENERATIVE LOCAL COMMUNITY INSTITUTE – JASON SCHULIST

What does GLCI do? They connect communities together in a peer learning network so that communities can learn and accelerate the outcomes by solving their thorny issues while increasing their problem solving capability. With face to face “go and see” events in multiple local communities that enable learning and collaboration, holding an annual capstone event – Skillsfest 3.0 in Appleton, WI, holding regional sharing events (Skillsfest-x) such as Cincinnati, through supporting local communities with tested practices, by matching people across the network so they may share and collaborate – MATCH.COM for communities, by capturing learning assets about methods and issues on behalf of the network, by assisting with community metrics and alignment and by developing cross-community projects based on the needs of the network alongside Universities – similar to the Construction Industry Institute (CII) model. How does the Generative Local Community Institute (GLCI) Operate? Applying problem solving methods to thorny community issues following key principles. 1. Respecting and engaging all 2. Applying scientific data-driven problem solving 3. Always striving for community True North 4. Developing passion for improvement with growth mindset 5. Leading with humility 6. Thinking systemically. So what are some Community benefits of joining the GLCI network? They are: Individual onboarding into network, Five free seats to the annual Skillsfest gathering in Appleton, WI, Hosting of Go and See event in your community with peer assist from other communities on your specific issue, Participation in webinars showcasing examples of effective community problem solving; opportunity to share your community’s story, Access to all website collaboration (methods, tools, learning, etc.), Shared access to body of knowledge related to methods used to solve community issues, Development of engagement strategy into the network for your community, Voluntary assessment of current local methods applied to community issues and a seat on Advisory board to guide focus and research. GLCI is supported by Catalysis and independent 501c3 education institute for creating peer learning networks of hospital systems. It was founded by John Toussaint, MD, CEO Emeritus of ThedaCare. Catalysis provides infrastructure support to GLCI with back office support, learning asset and standardized work support related to learning networks and applying the established peer learning network model developed by Catalysis into a community setting.
