Our July 16th program is **Bjorklunden: The Story of Lawrence University's Door County Campus**. Mark Breseman, Director of Bjorklunden since 1997, will give a presentation on Bjorklunden's unique history throughout the present day using a wonderful set of historic and current photographs.

Björklunden\* vid Sjön, Swedish for "Birch Grove by the Lake" is a 425-acre estate on the Lake Michigan shore just south of Baileys Harbor in picturesque Door County. A place of great beauty and serenity, the property includes meadows, woods, and more than a mile of unspoiled waterfront. Since 1980, Lawrence has sponsored a series of adult continuing-education seminars at Björklunden.
